## **IMMEDIATE ACTIONS**


Actions to be taken

- Leave the contaminated room and go into the open air.
- For first aid, wear a self-contained breathing apparatus or, if not possible, a suitable full cartridge mask
- Open the windows and set the fume hood (sorbonne) to its maximum flow rate.
- Consult a doctor urgently even without any symptoms (identify the product, CAS number, SDS).
- In case of massive inhalation, call:
  - SAMU (15 or 112),
  - Firefighters (18),
  - By SMS for the deaf and hard of hearing (114).

## **IN ANY CASE**

- Declare the accident (medical certificate required).
- Inform your safety manager immediately.
- All injuries are to be reported using the occupational health and safety logbook.
- Report all incidents to the **Occupational Health Doctor** for investigation and follow-up.

## PROTECTION MEASURES



- Wear protective glasses with side shields, suitable gloves and a closed gown.
- Wear an FFP3 mask, use hooded scales for weighing fine powders, away from air movements and away from
- Have a face mask with cartridge(s) suitable and in good condition for handling very toxic gases and volatile products.
